

Socialization: Meaning

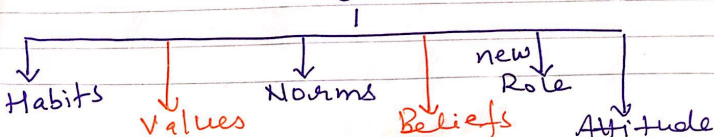
Socialization stands for the development of human brain, body, attituded behaviour and so on. The Cultural patterns of individual's group/society gets incorporated in his personality through this process.

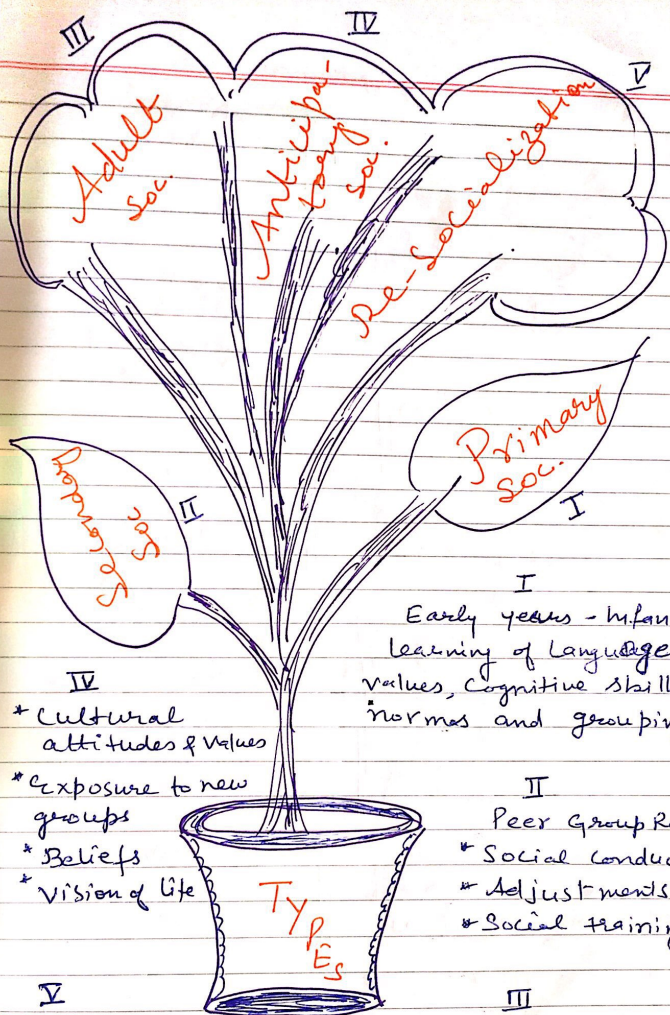
